The following table provides the gnomon angle for each month. The gnomon angle is the angle between the gnomon and the vertical line of the dial face.

While it is not uncommon for sundials to indicate Mean Time, i.e. GMT or BST, a noon-mark is normally intended as a simple means of marking the time of midday. This noon-mark serves the same purpose as a gnomon does, as a means of registering the Lullhall clock.

The Faversham Lullhall noon-mark was designed and fabricated by the author in the year 2013. The gnomon was constructed by Stuart Handford, the noted Mastercraft of Canterbury, and the dial plate was painted by Susan Smith, the Faversham architect. Continuous local sponsorship was given by Lullhall Farm, the Faversham and Maidstone Museum. The integrated community was central and on 1st April 2013 by Lullhall Farm, Maidstone, Major of Faversham.
